6:45-6:46 Board Action: Approve Minutes: March 9, 2015, General Meeting Motion to approve minutes without changes: Erica, Second: Meg

6:47-6:451 Board Action: Request for \$350 for Foster-Powell Garden Tour. Last year the budget was \$200. Nadia and Enrique will be organizing and contacting former garden hosts to join this year's tour by May 2nd.Christian motions to approve the increased funds, Vicki seconds.

6:51-6:55 General Action: Elections for Land Use Chair. Nominee, Shawn Morgan - Li Alligood, Chair. Erica motions to elect Shawn Morgan as the Land Use Chair, Vicki seconds, none are opposed.

6:55-7:02 Informational Speaker: Jenny Power -Oregon Education Association, Better Oregon Coalition spoke about economy and taxes: how we can work toward solving problems in community. Students need to be driven across town to get special needs met. Recession recovery has affected corporations for the better. Most Oregon families have seen wage decreases over the last 8 years. Recovery jobs are low wage and part time. 1 in 4 Oregonians are on food stamps. Taxes are not being paid equally. Oregon has the very lowest business taxes. Almost 400 large corps in Oregon paid no tax in 2013. We have lost 3400 teachers in the past few years-only a few hundreds are coming back. Solution: Coalition of Groups: Chronically underfunded schools and services. A ballot measure on 2016 ballot would raise taxes on the biggest corporations. Increasing the minimum wage and paid sick leave for all workers. Jenny asked us to sign up to help. Ouroregon.org. There are reports posted on the blog.

7:02- 7:09-Officer Tim Bacon-officer for the neighborhood. Foster-Powell is doing good. Break ins at the food carts? This also happened at 82nd carts. Lots of those on 82nd some have been caught recently. Crime is up a little from previous years but major crime is trending downward. To be safer: Light your homes, dogs, alarms and talk to your neighbors. Make them aware. Don't leave stuff in your cars. Tweakers happen at all times of day, fast cash folks. Alley ways, how to improve? They are travel routes. Call non-emergency if someone is back there that shouldn't be. Drive the alleys when you come home. Dusk to daylight night bulbs for the back fence is suggested. Speeding on Foster is a big problem-call traffic division. The streetscape may help.
